	<p>History - Stone Age to Iron Age Pupils study different aspects of life and changes in Britain from the stone Age to the Iron Age. Pupils learn about late Neolithic hunter-gatherers and early farmers. They study Bronze Age religion, technology and travel, for example, Stonehenge Pupils study Iron Age hill forts: tribal kingdoms, farming, art and culture.</p>	<p>1st half term History The Romans Pupils will study the Roman Empire and its impact on Britain. Pupils learn about the Roman Empire and the power of its army. They study the British resistance to Roman invasion, Boudicca This study includes a visit to the local Lunt Fort</p>	<p>1st half term History- Invaders Britain's settlement by Anglo Saxons and Scots Pupils study the Scot's invasion from Ireland to Scotland, the Anglo-Saxon Invasions, settlements and kingdoms, place names and village life and Anglo Saxon art and culture. 2nd half term geography - Marvelous Maps A study of the Local area and U.K. <i>Pupils will use fieldwork to observe, measure and record human and physical features in the local area using a range of methods, including sketch maps, plans and graphs and digital technologies. Pupils will use the eight points of a compass symbols and keys to build their knowledge of the United Kingdom.</i> <i>Pupils will name and locate counties and cities of the U.K. and geographical regions. Pupils will identify the human and physical characteristics of the regions and key topographical features (hills, mountains, coasts, rivers)</i> This study includes map work in the local area.</p>

What is a city/town/village? Pupils learn to name and locate counties and cities of the U.K. The study includes a field work trip around the city - stop off at different points selected to illustrate different features of the city. Portals to the past: <i>Greek Visitor</i></p>	<p><u>2nd half term History World War II</u> Local history This is a study of an aspect of significant local history from a period beyond 1066. Pupils learn about life during the Coventry Blitz and the impact of this on the City of Coventry.</p> <p>This study includes a visit to Coventry Cathedral and the Blitz Exhibition at the Herbert Art Gallery.</p>	<p><u>2nd half term Geography - Europe</u> A study of Europe (link to the Year 6 French Trip) Pupils use different maps to locate countries in Europe. They learn about the key human & physical features and major cities. They learn about similarities and differences between Coventry the region visited in France. map skills They learn to use OS maps of Europe. They study the human geography of the region. This study if also linked to the historical aspect of this region - a significant turning point in WW11 History - the D-Day Landings.</p>
