Dear Parents and Carers,

We've had a very exciting and productive start to the year. All the new children in Nursery and Reception have settled into school life really well.

We are always looking for new ways to improve the learning opportunities for children in school. To support our focus on maths we have launched a new initiative this term called "Maths No Problem". This is a teaching approach based on international research which has proved particularly successful in Singapore.

We are continuing our strong focus on reading in school and have introduced libraries into each classrooms to give children better access to a variety of different reading materials. We have employed lots of additional staff to support children with group reading. Parents are playing a big part too, we would like to thank all of the parents who have supported us this year by listening to their child reading at home, at least 4-times-a-week. In the first week of this term only 3 out of 13 classes met the 4-times-a-week challenge; by last week 10 out of 13 classes met this target. This is a fantastic improvement -well done parents and carers!

I hope you all have an enjoyable break from school next week. We look forward to welcoming the children back on Monday 30th October.

#### **Boomerang Programme**

During the last few weeks some of our pupils have taken part in a Boomerang programme. The aim of Boomerang is to give its members the tools to help them become more resilient and cope with anxiety and stress. It is a five-week programme which consists of an hour-session each week. Every week, a different topic is introduced, for example 'thoughts, feelings and behaviours' and 'building self-esteem'. Boomerang has been designed to help children learn different ways to cope with difficult feelings and to feel confident to manage difficult situations.

The sessions have been very successful, with pupils and staff commenting on how useful they have been. We are very fortunate to be one of the few schools in

Coventry to be involved in this programme.

We also have our own Mental Health Nurse who is in school once a week. There will be parent sessions offered in the near future, keep a look out for further information.



#### **Free School Meals**

Did you know...

All children in Years **Reception, 1 and 2** are automatically entitled to **free school meals!** This is called Universal Infant Free School Meals (UiFSM). There is no charge for this meal as UiFSM is a government funded programme.

Children in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 are only entitled to Free School Meals if a parent applies for them. This can be done by going to the following website:

Don't worry if your child prefers to bring a packed lunch, having your child registered for free school meals means that if you need to swap them to school meals at short notice you can do so. It also means your child is able to take in special meal days such as **Christmas Dinner** and the **Bonfire Meal** free of charge!


It is really important that all parents apply for free school meals, regardless of your child's year group, as this could raise an **extra £1,300 per year for the school**. This funding is used to support additional teachers and support staff for targeted group work with pupils, the School Counsellor, the Speech and Language Therapist. Even if your child is in Years Reception 1 and 2, applying for free school meals means the school will still get funding.

#### **Reminders!**

- Contacting the school: the
  School Office phones are on
  busy mode from 11:30am to
  1:00pm every day. If you urgently need to
  speak to someone during those times, please
  call the school and listen carefully to the
  message for instructions on how to contact a
  member of staff.
- Contact Details: All contact details must be kept up to date. If anyone, who is a contact for your child, changes their number you must alert the school immediately. Please call to inform us or visit the school office for a form.
- Change of Collection: If someone different will be collecting your child from school, please ensure that you have notified the school office or class teacher. The school will not allow your child to leave school with a different person without prior permission from the parent.
- ◆ Payments: All payments that are sent into school must be in envelopes marked with your child's name, class and what payment is for. The school does not provide envelopes.
- All payments that are sent into school must be the correct money—the school does not provide change.
- If finding envelopes and the correct change is a nuisance—why not pay online via the Schoolgateway!
- ◆ Lost Property: Please ensure that your child's personal belongings have their name written in them. It is impossible for us to identify who identical types of clothing, such as cardigans and jumpers, belong to.

#### **Separated Parents**

When parents are separated the school cannot "take sides" and prevent one parent from collecting a child from school on the "say-so" of the other parent.

Both parents are legally entitled to collect their child from school unless a court order is provided to the school which states otherwise.
